Tamara Jared, Director of URec.  
Motion by O'Malley to extend speakers time indefinitely. 2<sup>nd</sup> Clark.  
And Emily Maybrey.

Jared: We have a lot to show you today. Thanks for giving us the opportunity to discuss with you the recommended fee increase. I hope a lot of you are already very familiar with the Rec. You will see that the majority of students involve themselves in the rec on a daily basis...(reads mission statement).

(Shows video).

Jared: Primarily full time students use the Student Rec Complex. We had a company do research for us in 2005. They found 86% of the student body is in one way or another using our services and facilities... The URec timeline, In 1983 a \$5 was assessed to build the complex... A long time ago there was a significant fee increase to support facilities. IN 2002 we came to the students and said, Let's do some things. The facility was not at industry or student standards. We increased the fee and from there began a flurry of activity... We are dead last in comparison to our peers, we have a low number of square footage per student. We are second to last in our state in... We grow to the size of our bowl. Like a goldfish. Our key expenses, the green is overall expenses (references a chart)...So what happens, low revenue, high costs. We are projected to work at a significant deficit. We are sustaining ourselves with our reserves. We have some major repairs that need to take place. We asked the SRFC for a \$25 increase, \$5 in 2009, to \$30. And increase the Summer fees in 2009. With the fee increase we would be on par with our peers. Students are being forced to go to other gyms that charge a lot more money with less service. Even with the fee increase, we will still be cheaper than other local gyms. Groupx is one of our fastest growing groups, and we have to turn people away. With the fee increase, groupx would be free. We could increase to midnight. Eventually we would eliminate the climbing and intramural fee. From 5:30-6:30 we are very packed. 86% of students will be affected by these changes. Groupx will grow by 42%, as seen by the 46% drop off from free week to pay weeks. The average student pays 10-20 dollars for intramural. Climbing gym is expected to increase by 60% when the climbing gym is free. We only have 4 ft/student. We are trying to get an online service, with many advantages. Online would provide yoga classes and nutrition tips, and this is coined "virtual space". Other benefits: eliminate extra fees, add one hr open, online classes... there will be other opportunities to hear this same speech. We are a very transparent organization and we wouldn't be able to hide anything anyway.

Questions:

When the uhigh gym burned down, we allowed hem to use our space. That space will be used for more female specific time.

Energy Efficient? We have many green initiatives. Like not turning on some lights and separating the light fixtures so that many of the lights can be turned off.

More companies like smoothie king? We cant add more square footage so we can only reconfigure the space. We have something's in the works but I cannot comment on those things right now.

Student Input? We love feedback, but now there are things like this senate.

Mcentire- I have been nickel and dimed. I have to keep paying these expenses and am not getting anything out of these fees.

Answer: I can empathize. I understand having more more money going out than coming in... if LSU is still a good school, the quality of your degree will be higher.

Prestridge I know you mentioned forums. What other methods are you looking for to inform students.

Answer: Luckily we've had through coverage in the Rev.

Elliott: Can you go back to the square footage per student... Does that include fields?

Answer: That is only indoor space.

Elliott: Can you compare the outdoor facilities...

Answer: The northern schools do not have the outdoor facilities to rival ours. But the southern school yes...

Elliott: The fees will improve this number?

Answer: Hopefully at the end f the four years, we'll be at a place. Where we can do that.

Elliott: Like you said a large chunk of the budget is mortgage...have you looked in to refinancing?

Answer: We have looked into it. But we couldn't find an alternative.

Chandler: Have you thought about adding it optional? I know personally I have friends who use the rec and I don't use it. Have you thought of making it optional for students who use it.

Answer: Lots of efforts have been put in to sponsorship. But that relationship has to be grown. .. The Forever LSU Campaign...we are way down on the list. WE have been bumped up on funding by the LSU foundation. For the 14% that don't use, it comes back to the sense of community. A long time ago students decided this should be community wide.

Oaks: Is there any plan to increase parking?

Blanco: Advertising?

Answer: Reveille

McMann: Worst case scenario, do you have a backup plan.

Answer: yes. Its an unfortunate plan and we will have to go back to the students. We will come back and ask yall what to cut.

O'Malley: Any shot to get rid of locker and towel rental fee?

Answer: Yes, for students.

Executive Officer Reports.

Alsfeld: I'd like to start by promoting this speaker. We spent \$1000 from Initiatives. She is an associate professor at Princeton University. Thursdays Feb 7 email Sabina. We had a meeting regarding safety with (lists offices). It was a good collaboration I wanted to get everyone on the same page about the measure we have in place for our safety. One of the things we will try to do is promote what each office has in place for your safety. Campus is safe, but the perception is poor. As student leaders we ask you to spread the word to the students. I asked about the cameras. They were in the process of installing new cameras, when the incident occurred. They put 7 cameras near the Nicholson apartments There are 7 in the quad and res life areas. Res life talked about RAs doing rounds around the outside of the facility to report light outages... They said the had a problem with tailgating... People entering the building or putting cards in front of doors so that they locks don't work. Res life puts out a safety broucher. They basically expressed concern over the tape on the door concept. This is something that the campus community is doing and we're only hurting ourselves. The said that our lighting is testing above

standard... WE are going to link the crime alert page to our website. Basically I want to show you that we are being proactive with this. We are not spreading the word on safety. Public Safety Week will be coming up... Be proactive.... We will team up with other departments to promote our safety.

Sellers: When I walk right here. the lights are on reverse motion sensor, or don't really work...

Alsfeld: I didn't think to ask about those,...email our staff, facility services.

Sellers: When one of those go out, it literally leaves a black spot.

Gammon: You talk about the area near miller a lot... But near the new dining hall is very dark.

Alsfeld: I've been concerned about that area, I've expresses the need for more lighting there.

Chandler: I live in the Pentagon and it has some of the least amount of security. Two cops sit next to each other talking... maybe if they were on bikes they might be more active.

Alsfeld: ill look in to that. I have some concerns about myself...

Chandler: Has there been thought given to putting cameras in each Pentagon stack, since there are not desks...

Aslfeld: We can look in to that. Funding for the cameras is tough...

King: Your free printing does work! You have a \$5 credit and you can use it at a printer. We have to let students know about this. Hopefully it will grow to free printing on campus for students. That's the vision, it was approved knowing this will be something we have for a long time. The administration knows and appreciates this. Second, i've been in discussion with a lot of people to centralize traditions at LSU. A counsel has been created to bring all offices together to enhance and streamline the traditions. This is a launching point for ideas. This will maintain the education and preservation of our traditions. This is not a new idea, it's a great initiative. This is what were here for to create lasting change. This is great.

Blanco: What will you do regarding printing...

King: Whatever money isn't used, goes into an account for future printing. Right now there is no roll over.

Blanco: Can we give the money back to the student?

King: It will go back to funding printing quota. It does not go directly back to the student.  
O'Malley: does free printing work for the copier?

King: No Copiers are on a different system. We are looking into bridging the gap.

O'Malley: Traditions... Texas AM tosses their ring into a pitcher of beer and drinking it down. Alum associations and funding are there. The chancellor was please and put it on the Forever LSU campaign.

Director Caldwell: I want to let you know, that I am in the back taking money for the geaux red shirts. The deadline will be Friday.

Prestrdige: Paying?

Caldwell: Until Friday morning...

Director Wishek: Acting director Wishek, I'm a little less nervous. Cassie spoke to yall about the safety meeting on Monday. I attended and she basically gave you all the goings on. I will put the minutes from that on our website. I will talk with Facility Services on their stay safe campaign. We will advertise a lot soon. President campus Primary will start tomorrow. It could be really great. Assistant Director Martinez has been working really hard on the website. We want to start the blog, and keeping it updated weekly. I will update after this. The blog will cover every branch. If you want something promoted, let me know. We can only publicize so much... but we can hope that the greater media picks up on it. We can only spread the word through the outlets we have.

Bryant: Who should we contact about a mistake in our contact information...

Wishek: Me, or straight to Stephen.

Commissioner of Elections Gower: First the election dates have slightly changed. Filing 20-22 wed, Thursday, Friday. Campaigning will start the 29<sup>th</sup> election day April 2<sup>nd</sup>. Run off April 9<sup>th</sup>. I need some suggestions... I want to publicly announce the election dates. I'd like to broadcast it through screensavers, the TVs in the front of the union, broadcast email. If you have any other ideas, let me know. Second we're going to do something new... A youtube style debate with TigerTv. If you have idea, I'd love input. Thank you for the ten thousand dollars. 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row we won the state competition in debate.

Director of Finance: As you can see, those are not all of our accounts. AS you can see accounting services didn't start on our balances until today. I'll have revues from students fees listed soon.. College Council accounts are not included.

Sellers: Who has access to each of these accents?

Finance: There is a break down in our handbook. The CAS account is one I want to look at. They get more money than all SG. A memo in your handbook describes this.

O'Malley: What's up with ORF?

Finance: One year, they gave away too much money. People ask for thousands of dollars...

Alsfeld: The business manager we are hiring will greatly help us stay on track.

Clark: Before I get in to my qualification let me give you some background. I've been a member of the senate for the past two years... I am the current vice chair of the AAA committee for the past two semesters. During my first term I served on the rules committee... This past semester I served on the election code revision committee. I worked with the speaker to revise the senate agenda and I also sponsored a bill to help streamline our process... It's very important that the speaker pro temp have a strong background in rules. When I first decided I wanted to run for this office, I spoke with the speaker about this. One of the rules he notes was leading the office. I've come to a couple recommendations for this. I would work to read over the bills to cut down on technical amendments. We waste a lot of time with tech amendments. Also the amendments that are made in committee don't always make it in to the binder. It's not my only aims to work with rule changes and the agenda. I joined SG to change thing and I am very passionate. We have started a dialogue regarding the W policy, the priority point system. I also think its important for the Speaker pro temp to look at many sides of an issue before making a decision. I know I can put in the time. It's important for me that you support me. If I am elected I will work hard and put in all the time required. We have a great chance to use our elected power. I hope you stand beside me.

Jackson: I am a senator from the college of arts and sciences. We are setting a tone tonight. We need to pick an individual with experience. I have attended the rules meetings under Senator Hebert. He was inspirational. Jacqueline took up his chair and was a great replacement. I'd like to bring the same intensity they brought. I have served on two temp election revision committees and rules. I feel that working on the leg. Staff has helped me get a good vantage point. Three of my important contributions include getting no students fees used on banquets, the one baton rouge metro council proposals. In this chamber we have of the most dedicated students on campus. We need to continue our amazing programming. I would hold info session for new senators.

Questions for the candidates:

Lopreore: tell us how you worked to increase transparency to the student body?

Bret: I wanted to get the office hours put in the free speech alley. I also liked the voter drive.

Ben: if elected I was hoping to get a more efficient way of showing when a senator is actually doing their office hours.

Debate:

Motion to limit debate time to 2 minutes... Passed

Allen—speaking for Clark. I was a new senator in the fall and he was very helpful in teaching me the proper rules. We have seen that he would be an excellent candidate  
Bryant—senator Clark would be able to work for his office. He has been ethical and has done many things for the student body. Jackson might seem better because he is always in the office with the speaker. He would do a really good job.

Blanco—he really wants this. He works very hard and is very knowledgeable. His the acting chair for the Rules. Last semester I was in here, and some people were not taking the vote seriously. Clark was one of those senators that did not take the votes seriously. I think that shows a lack of respect for the position and the students.

Lopreore: I echo what Blanco said. Jackson has more experience with rules than Clark. The most important issue to keep in mind... The number one senate initiative is to keep transparency. Jackson has always fought for this. He worked against the spending of student fees on banquets. Clark promises to do that, but hasn't. I am 100% behind Jackson.

Call: I am in favor of Jackson. He has two jobs, and a full time students and he handles his business well. He is at every meeting he needs to be at. He works very hard.

Prestridge: This is a very important election. I think both would do a good job. But I have always been impressed with senator Clark. He has been asking questions since day one. I am nervous right now, because I want to speak well for Clark. If Ben believes in something he does not waver. I'm glad he has the opportunity to run for this. He doesn't want the job for the title. He honestly believe he will do well in the position. He has excellent organization skills and a rules background. I think Clark is the epitome of a senator..

Palermo: I am in support of Ben Clark. I will counter argue Blanco. Let me reiterate how impressive Clark has been. We both ran for Senate last fall. He was the only individual he didn't join a campaign last fall and won. He has been in the body an entire semester longer than Brett. We were on the rules committee together. Ben is an open book. Last semester as vice chair of HIT... Senator Jackson approached me directly. And asked me if I was ok with him being my vice chair.

Motion to extend. 2<sup>nd</sup>. Objection. Fails.

Brinks: First, a lot has been brought up for how nice or accommodating these guys are. They're both nice, friendly, good senators...differences. Jackson has been the acting

chair of rules and the vice chair last semester. To me, that is the most important thing. I support Jackson.

Palermo: To finish.. Jackson pulled me out of the office and said, can I be hit vice chair, I spoke to Robertson about this. As SOON as Cohen resigned he jumped on the rules bandwagon. He has also ran for a senate seat, before his term ended. And is a top official in a spring campaign. I think that's a conflict.

Ricci: i'm in favor of Jackson. I've known him since we were 12. He's a great guy... People have admitted that Clark is not a proficient public speaker. For that he shouldn't have the job.

Blanco: campaigning has nothing to do with this room. Its not a valid point to me. Anything you can say positive about Clark can be said for Jackson. He loves the body and helping the students. His respect of the body is evident. There is nothing but positive things to say about him. And the campaign being mentioned is unacceptable.

Cortina: Please leave your political agenda at the door. Don't base it on who's running with whom. That's foolishness.

Mcentire: I've had a moment to organize my thoughts. I hadn't planned to stand before you. Both are obviously devoted servants. I'd like to point out, ones capacity speak eloquently is not natural. Neither of them is a proficient public speaker. TO stand before the body to criticize their speaking skills is beneath this body. We must look at who will serve best and who has endeavored to serve the body best.

Remson: Dedication, Determination and Prove it. Both are qualified. I rise up for one, Clark. I have had an opportunity to meet him through SG. He ran as an independent. In a heated battle, he won. He was wanted to help students since day on and got his position on determination. Rules is Not the only thing you have to worry about in the position. Clark has the time and dedication. His actions speak volumes and his presence is strong. He is very helpful and I urge you to support him. He's been on track since day one, and takes on his own initiatives. I urge you to support Ben Clark.

Abon: I would like to speak on behalf of Jackson. I think Mcentire said it best. Public speaking doesn't do the job. It's a dimension of the job. But not the whole job. Jackson leadership on campaigns was called in to question. I'm an optimist and I see this as is commitment to the students. I urge you to please support him.

Lopreore: All this talk about Clark being elected independent... That's great. I'm sure he's really popular, Senator Jackson also ran last semester independent and won. I'm sure Clark is sweet enough to rot your teeth out, but Jackson is obviously more qualified for the position. There is no reason to believe Jackson is more qualified.

Prestrdige: I think the point regarding elections is that Ben ran independently on a ticket... When Brett ran the first time he was on Moving Forward. I don't want to talk

negatively but Ben Clark is more experienced. He's been in Senate a whole semester more.

Bryant: first, there was something mentioned about Clark's experience. But Clark has been on much longer. Than Jackson. The other thing, if you want to mention Jackson running in the fall he ran when the term limit wasn't up it was unethical. The legislation stopping this was passed a semester later.

O'Malley: For reference I ran unopposed the first time I ran. I do not feel qualified to chair rules, even if I ran independent. Look at their past within the senate. Last semester we didn't pass too many finance bills, but we did pass some written by Brett Jackson. Jackson met students who needed help and he just did it. He didn't pass the buck, he was willing to make it happen. Think of this when voting.

Chandler: When Andy's bill to get kicked off college council, Jackson pointed out that he has two jobs and lots of school work and dint have time for meetings. Does he have the time. Is all im asking.

Remson: First, when voting vote for who you really want to take the job. I've had lots of leadership experience. There are alt of leaders that like the attention Some stand behind the scenes though. And that is exactly what Clark does. Just because he isn't in your face, doesn't mean he isn't working. He has been committed to the W policy, but does it quietly. That's the leader I like. Pro-Temp is behind the scenes, we need that leader.

Gammon: While Jackson does have 4 bills up tonight... they are not of high quality. Quality not quantity. Ben Clark works behind the scenes. He's working on the W policy and priority points. Ben always has good questions. Remember this when voting. Quality.
